



Camille Saint-Saens

Camille Saint-Saens was a French composer who was born in 1835. He wrote lots of music. He initially wrote the piece **The Carnival of the Animals** as a joke for his friends. He never meant for anyone to hear it because he wanted to be seen as a serious composer, but it's incredibly famous today.

Listening Skills

In The Carnival of the Animals, each animal is **represented** by a different musical **instrument**. Saint-Saens chose these instruments because he wanted them to have a certain effect on the listener. Instruments can be played at different **tempos**, **pitches** and **dynamics** to change the way they sound. When composing The Carnival of the Animals, Saint-Saens thought about how the different instruments represented the different animals. To understand why Saint-Saens made the choices that he did, you must listen closely to spot the differences between the pieces of music.
