

Key Works and Key Artists

Land art or earth art is art that is made straight into the landscape,



sculpting the land itself into earthworks or making structures in the landscape using natural materials such as rocks or twigs. The most famous land art work is Robert Smith-

son's Spiral Jetty, which is so large that it was made with JCB diggers! Land art is usually made of earth, rock, mud, stone, wood, twigs and other nature based materials that will weather and age because they are outside. This changes how the art looks over time.

Spiral Jetty

Land artists draw 2D designs on paper to make a finished artwork in 3D. They choose natural materials carefully and their use of line, colour and shape make their audience recall physical rather than human landscape features, like waves or trees.

Nancy Holt's sun tunnels make us think of the warmth, colour and brightness of the sun with their cylinder shape. They are large tubes made of concrete, lined up with the sunrise and sunset.



Richard Long did not make a shape. He made a line! He simply walked up and down in a field of grass, until he had made a mark in the earth. He called this artwork, 'A long line made by walking'!

LAND ART

Materials, Techniques and Tools:

Tools are needed to fix the natural materials to each other to create the shapes

and design of a finished piece of land art.

weathered wood

a mallet

bamboo

By using flexible materials like bamboo, people can create different lines and shapes in their artwork. Bamboo can be cut into shapes or pushed into the earth to make a line or re-

call a landscape feature like forlests or waves.



Using hand drills to put holes in wood first, then means mallets and wood

dowels can fix pieces of wood together.



Wood can also be fixed together by tying. This is called lashing.

This is a square lash because
