


Key Vocabulary	
fastener	used to hold two pieces of a gar- ment together (snaps, hooks and eyes, self-gripping devices, but- tons and buttonholes, and zippers)
hem	the edge of a piece of cloth or clothing that has been turned under and sewn
stitch	a loop of thread or yarn result- ing from a single pass or move- ment of the needle in sewing
sustainable materials	items that are produced and used by humans in an environ- mentally-responsible way
target market	a particular group of consumers at which a product or service is aimed
upcycling	reuse (discarded material) in such a way as to create a prod- uct of higher quality or value than the original

A. Use a pin to hold





- B. Whip stitch 3 or

Select the material.


4. Use back stich and blanket stitch to make the garment.


Haute couture is the creation of exclusive custom-fitted high-end fashion design.



# Textiles - Clothing

#### Back Stitch

The back stitch is a simple outline stitch in hand embroidery. It joins straight stitches together to create a line that is simple and versatile. The backstitch has a "beady" look that gives embroidery patterns that unique, hand-made texture.



## Blanket Stitch

Blanket stitch is used for working the edges of table-covers, mantel valances, blankets, etc., or for edging any other material, including clothing. The blanket stitch is similar to the method used for the buttonhole stitch but there is more space between the stitches and a definite requirement for even regularity.
