Dough modelling is a traditional folk art in China. People use their hands and simple tools to mold material into different life like models. In China, dough modelling plays an important role throughout the different events in a person's life.



Decorative Techniques:

1. Cutting — use tools to create holes or hollows in our models.



2. Carving — use tools to carve designs and details into clay.



3. Hatching — use this technique to join pieces of clay together.



Modelling Techniques:

- 1. Rolling use your hands to roll the clay into a ball.
- snake shape.
- 3. Pinching pull and pinch the clay with your fingers to get it in the shape that you want.
- your fingers.






