


Performance — Call and Response



In music, a call and response is a series of **two** parts: the first musicians sings or uses instruments for the call. This is followed by a response.

Call and response has its roots in traditional African music. Other genres that have call and response are: rock and roll, pop, folk songs and classical music.

Call and Echo

CALL: Echoes, I can hear you.

RESPONSE: Hear you, hear you.

CALL: Though I can't get near

Question and Answer

CALL: Who's got trouble?

RESPONSE: We've got trouble!

CALL: How much trouble?

RESPONSE: Too much trouble!

Statement and Response

CALL: Come home all my ducks

and geese.

RESPONSE: No, we won't.

CALL: Why not?

RESPONSE: It's the wolf.

Frisemble

An ensemble is a group of people who work or perform together.



Pitch

The pitch of a sound is how high or low the sound is.
