



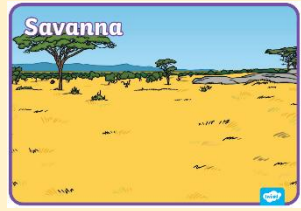
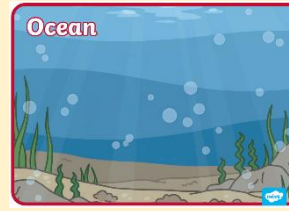
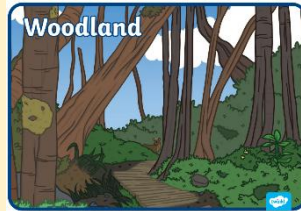
Year 2 – Living Things and their Habitats

Key Vocabulary

dead	things that were alive once but are no longer alive
food chain	a way of showing what organism eats what
habitat	the place where an organism lives
living	things are born, grow, reproduce and eventually die
microhabitat	a small, specific habitat that supports the survival of certain animals or plants, such as, a rock-pool or a rotting log
never been alive	things that have never been alive and things that are made of substances that were never alive, such as plastics and metals
organisms	all living things are organisms
predators	animals that kill other animals for food
prey	an animal that gets eaten by other animals
producers	plants - all plants produce their own food from water, air and light
consumers	animals that eat plants or other animals

Habitats

A habitat is the place where an organism (a living thing) lives.



Microhabitats

Microhabitats are small, specific habitats that help certain animals or plant survive.

A food chain can be used to show what animals eat.

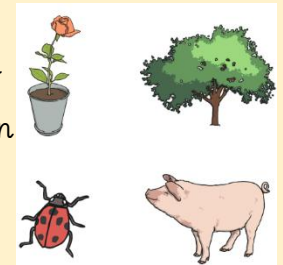


The arrows mean 'is eaten by'.

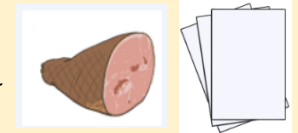


States of Living
